

# GOAT VACCINES & ANNUAL SHOTS

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## CD&T VACCINE

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Prevents "overeating disease" and Tetanus

Annual dose for adult goats

One month before kidding for expectant mothers

Kids vaccinated at 6 weeks, and then given a booster a month later

Given as a subcutaneous shot

## BOSE INJECTION

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Provides Selenium and Vitamin E

Annual dose for adult goats (or more or less frequently depending on selenium in your area)

One month before kidding for expectant mothers

Sometimes given to kids a month after birth, or sooner if recommended by a vet.

Given as a subcutaneous shot.

## DEWORMER

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Often given based on 'Famacha' score of goat  
Ivermectin is the most common dewormer, but there are many options

Can also be given annually or seasonally, or continuously as a herbal supplement.

## COPPER BOLUS

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Given depending on the copper content in your area  
In copper deficient areas, given to adult goats twice a year

Also given if signs of copper deficiency appear

Given as a 'bolus' using a bolus gun

## OTHER MINERALS

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Always provide loose minerals

Loose minerals allow the goats to consume what they need to keep their diets balanced

Baking soda can be offered to prevent bloat

Zinc may be offered in deficient areas
